About SOAG ...

SOAG is one of the most active independent amateur archaeology societies in Oxfordshire. It was established in 1969 and currently has about 140 members. Its aims are to promote a practical interest in archaeology and allied disciplines. We work frequently in collaboration with other community organisations who have an active interest in their local heritage. We have productive relations with several commercial archaeology companies, local universities, and the regional National Trust Archaeologist; and we have a good relationship with the Finds Liaison Officer for the national Portable Antiquities Scheme. We pride ourselves on our high standards: all our project plans are agreed with the Oxfordshire County Archaeologist. SOAG is affiliated to the Council for British Archaeology South Midlands Group.

Fieldwork: we provide opportunities for members to take part in archaeological excavations, surveys and "geophysics", field-walking and post-excavation work.

Lectures and visits: we hold monthly meetings from October to April. Lectures by professional speakers & members are given on a wide range of topics in an informal atmosphere. Field trips & visits are made to places of interest, sometimes sites not open to the public.

Current fieldwork projects

Our current major long-term project is the excavation of a Romano-British settlement at **Smokedown Farm** near Faringdon. Examples of ongoing collaborative projects at **Kelmscott Manor**, **Chinnor Community Orchard**, **Simms Farm** (near Bicester), and **Greys Court**.

Recently-completed significant projects have been the excavation of a Roman Villa at **Gatehampton** near Goring-on-Thames, a Romano-British temple site at **High Wood** near Henley-on-Thames, and the multi-period study of The Grange at **Wyfold**. We also have an ongoing mainly desk-based programme studying the **Landscape Archaeology** of Oxfordshire. Members of SOAG are frequently also given the opportunity of participating in projects run by neighbouring archaeology organisations.
